Last fiscal year, we faced economic uncertainties which pushed us to be more frugal and flexible than ever, to ensure continued services for people in need. We saw thousands of people seeking help, many for the first time, after job losses and tremendous stress.

We were ready to help and fulfill our mission to reach and uplift people in greatest need in our community. Your continued financial and volunteer support made that possible. We are so grateful! Our actions required faith and an intense hands-on approach by donors, board members and staff.

- We helped a homeless youth move a couch into his new apartment.
