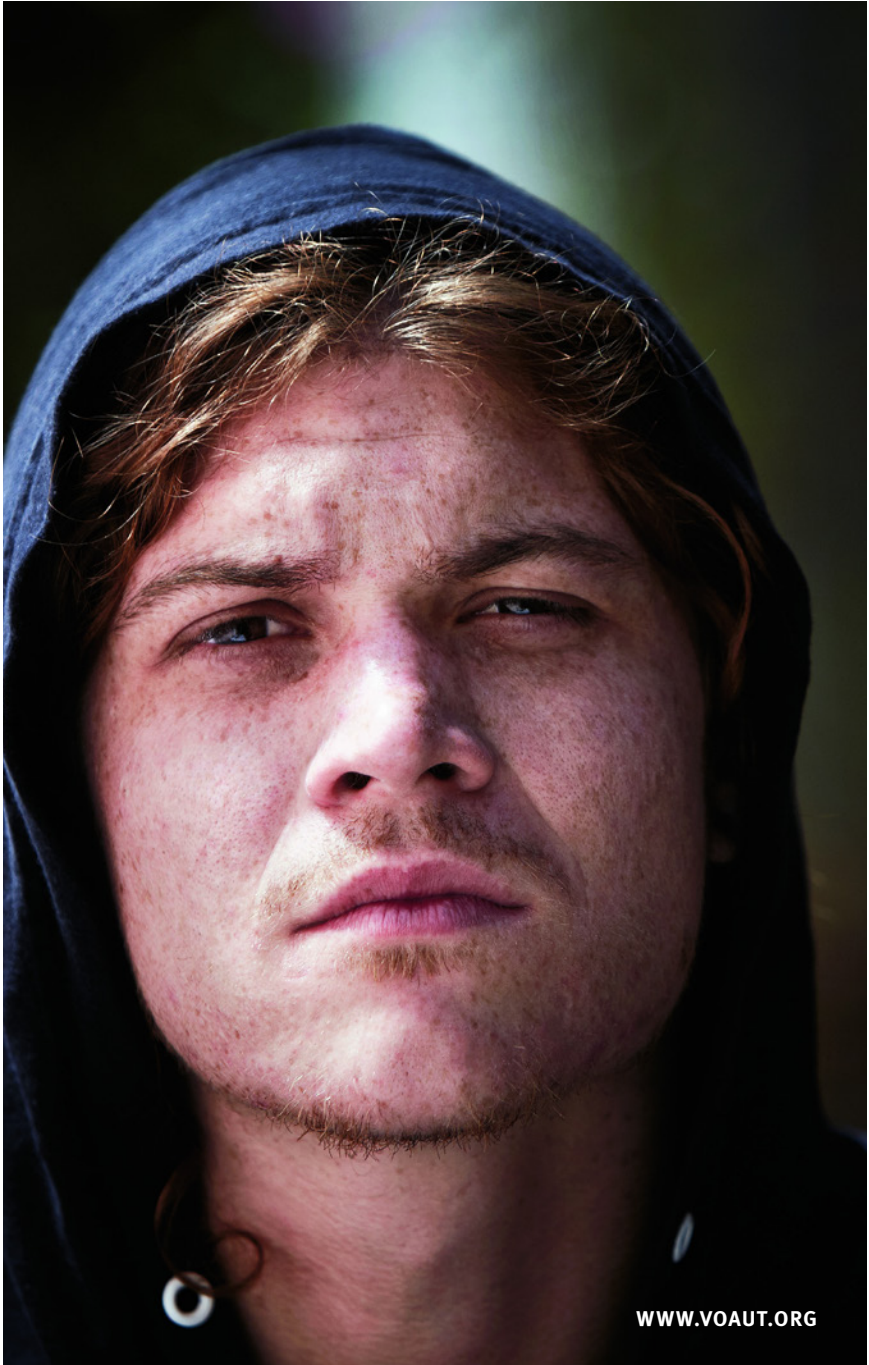


HOMELESS YOUTH LEGAL CLINIC
